MORE FIGHTING TAKES PLAGE
IN THE SOUDAN
Ggyytian Forces Reported to Have Been Defeated and the Tenth Battalion Destroyed.
London, Jan. 16 -The Morning Leader publishes the following dispatches from Cairo: "Rumors are in sirculation here that on December 28th, the Dervishes under Emir Fedil, on the Blue Nile, defeated the Egyptian forces, the Tenth Soudanese Battalion being entirely des. troyed. It is reported that reinforcements are being hurried to the scene and
imminent."
(This news is not eredited lby other influential and well informed journals.)
According to a dispateh from
Cairo on January 5 th, Colonel Lewis with a Soudanese regiment and a detachment of irregular troops atformidable Dervish chief, while he was crossing the Blue Nile on December 26 th, at the cataract south of Roseiro, storming the island on which Fedil took up his position
and capturing 1590 Dervishes, Fedil, however, escaped with 300 followers
